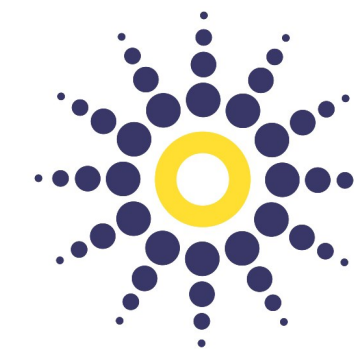

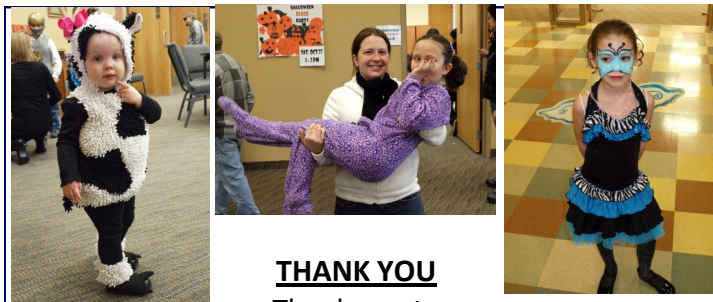

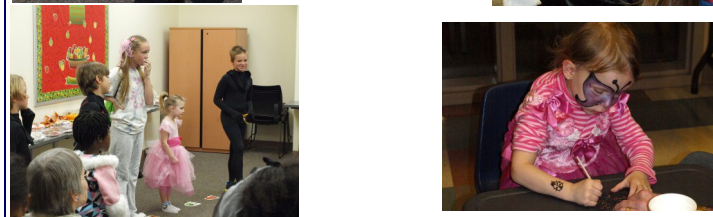
On Sunday, November 11, we will join Christians around the world and participate in a special monetary collection for Orphan’s Lifeline.

Some of their more frequent projects include packing food into boxes in an assembly line, re-packaging bulk food (pasta, beans, etc.) into smaller bags for more manageable distribution, and sorting through their donated food and packing it into boxes for food shelves.
