Our 7 PM Wednesday Study will continue on the Zoom format.

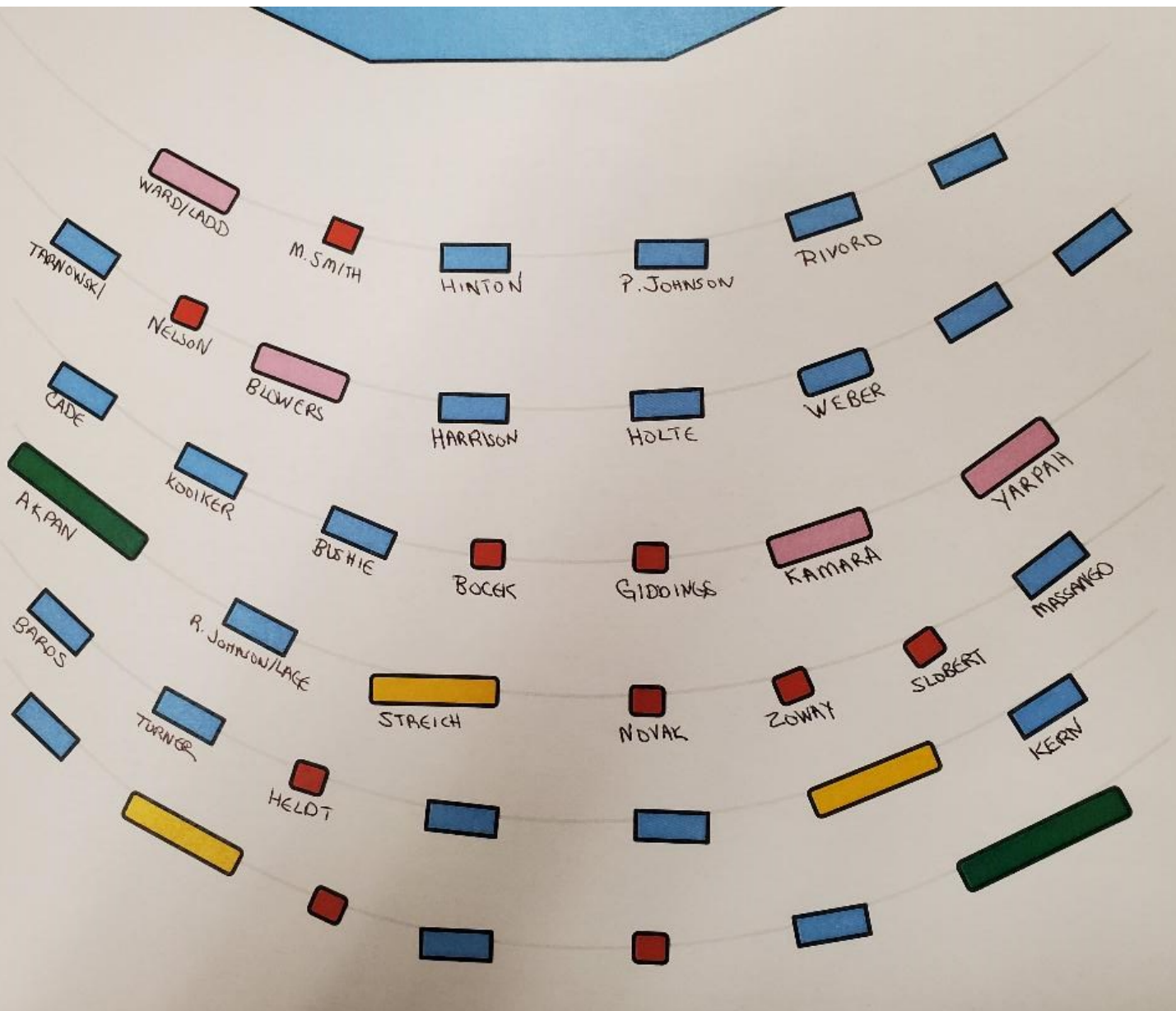
