- aerosol cans



Mision Para Cristo Update:

Mision Para Cristo has been serving in Nicaragua and Honduras for 25 years, focusing on three areas: Church, Children, and Medical. Our goal is to be sharing Jesus as we serve others.

CHURCH: We work with the church with 24 congregations in the North Central area of Nicaragua to provide support, supplies, training, and encouragement to keep the main thing being the main thing: so that all can come to know our Lord.

CHILDREN; Our main areas of service with children are Kingdom Kids, a child sponsor program that serves over 1,000 children in Nicaragua and Honduras, For Kids, For Kingdom, For Eternity, and our Annual Smiles (A Smile for a Child at Christmas) project that will touch 20,000 children this year.

MEDICAL: Our full-time medical clinic, serving Casa Materna (a place where mothers-to-be come to be close to medical care to have their babies) and Sustainable Living Project (Community Development) are the anchors of our Medical Outreach.

The last four years have been a significant challenge to the mission and the church. Still, God has blessed us with your and others' support not to have to reduce staff (we currently have 106 staff members in Nicaragua and Honduras) or modify any areas of service. During this time, we have been able to plant three new congregations, add three Kingdom Kids locations, and respond to need from the two Hurricanes that hit Nicaragua last November. That response includes putting over 600 waters filters in homes, distributing over 9,000 packets of food, planted gardens, and seed for farmers to replant, and sharing the hope we have in Jesus. And we continue to serve in hurricane-affected areas.
