## I. WHO IS JEHOVAH-NISSI?

As with Jehovah-Jireh and Jehovah-Rophe - Jehovah-Nissi is one of the 80 compound names of God. Like the others, it combines “Yahweh” - the self-existent or eternal one - with “Nissim” meaning “my banner” or “my victory”. So, **Jehovah-Nissi** means that our God is the God who gives us victory in all the physical, emotional, and spiritual battles we face - against all odds.

## II. WHAT IS THE ORIGIN OF JEHOVAH-NISSI? - EXODUS 17:1-16
