Operation Empowering Hope Outreach Opportunity

Northern Light Church will be hosting a supply drive for soldiers serving at the American army base in Fairbanks Alaska.



The supplies we collect will be distributed by the chaplains to get some basic supplies that the soldiers are in need of and also for soldiers entering quarantine for 10-14 days. The soldiers who are new to the base or test positive for Covid are assigned to a small room with no tv, no WIFI, limited to no cell coverage, and they are allowed to bring only their military clothing and a small personal bag with them. The following is a list of items they could use:

- Letters encouraging the soldiers to know they are appreciated & not forgotten
- Footcare items such as mole skin, foot cream or powder, and band aids
- Activity books (Sudoku, Wordfind, Word Search)
- Adult coloring books, journals & colored pens, colored pencils with sharpener
- Snacks individually wrapped (Candy, Gum, granola bars, etc.)
- Games, portable handheld that a soldier can do alone (cards, Rubik's Cube, travel size games)

We will have a collection barrel available for your items during the month of May. You can also participate with a financial donation that will help with shipping costs.

Purpose:

To educate the populace of the high suicide rates in army, encourage chaplains on the base, and supplying Army chaplains with material goods to boost the soldiers morale and become a conduit of God's hope & salvation for the soldiers.

We are a 501(C)(3) non profit currently serving Fort Wainwright Base. We work with the chaplains and Religious Specialist at the American army base in Fairbanks Alaska which has one of the highest suicide rates of all army bases. Our heart is to provide the chaplains with materials that the soldiers want, empowering the chaplains to become a conduit of God's love, a safe place for the soldiers to learn about God and find salvation so that suicide is not an option any more.
