REASONS TO PRAY BEFORE WE SPEAK OR MAKE ANY VOWS—JUDGES 10-11

 Make sure I am following scripture and not cult 	1.	Make sure	I am following	scripture	and not	culture
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2. Don't make rash vows

Don't trap yourself by making a rash promise to God and only later counting the cost.

Proverbs 20:25 (NLT)

3. I don't need to make these kinds of deals with God

4. Be a person who keeps my word

"You have also heard that our ancestors were told, 'You must not break your vows; you must carry out the vows you make to the LORD.' But I say, do not make any vows! Do not say, 'By heaven!' because heaven is God's throne. And do not say, 'By the earth!' because the earth is his footstool. And do not say, 'By Jerusalem!' for Jerusalem is the city of the great King. Do not even say, 'By my head!' for you can't turn one hair white or black.
