II. INTRODUCTION TO THE BOOK OF REVELATION—1:1-8

1. Origin: God the Father, God the Son – Jesus Christ, and God the Holy Spirit (1:1-2,4-8,12-18)

- **2. Time:** To reveal things that were going to happen in the near future (1:1; 22:6,10; See 2 Timothy 4:9-13,19-21)
- **3. Purpose:** To encourage Christians living during the last part of the first century and of any era to remain hopeful and faithful despite facing persecution, difficulties and suffering (1:3; 2:7,10,11,26; 3:5,12,21)

"Do not seal up the words of the prophecy of this book, because the time is near.

Revelation 22:10 (NIV)

Major methods of interpretation:

- Futurist
- Continuous-Historical
- Preterist
- Historical Background/Spiritual
- **4. Writer:** John, the Apostle (1:1,4,9)
- **5. Recipients:** Specifically to the seven churches of Asia and then generally to Christians of any era (22:18-19)
- **6. Style:** Apocalyptic literature "unveils" or "reveals" some hidden truth using symbolic and hyperbolic language
- 7. Date: Most likely during the reign of the Roman Emperor, Domitian (About A.D. 81 to 96).
- **8.** Location: Isle of Patmos—where John had been exiled as a prisoner of Rome (1:10)
