. WHY GOD'S JUDGMENT IS NECESSARY

1. God's judgment demonstrates that He cares

The LORD is close to the brokenhearted; he rescues those whose spirits are crushed.

Psalm 34:18 (NLT)

2. God's judgment displays His character

The LORD demands accurate scales and balances; he sets the standards for fairness.

Proverbs 16:11 (NLT)

3. God's judgment destroys evil

The devil, who deceived them, was cast into the lake of fire and brimstone where the beast and the false prophet are. And they will be tormented day and night forever and ever.

Revelation 20:10 (NKJV)

4. God's judgment empowers me to forgive

1. Silence in heaven (v.1)

2. Seven angels with seven trumpets stand before God (v.2)

3. Another angel stands at the altar (v.3-5)

Alexander the metalworker did me a great deal of harm. The Lord will repay him for what he has done. You too should be on your guard against him, because he strongly opposed our message.

2 Timothy 4:14-15 (NIV)

4. Seven angels prepare to sound the seven trumpets (v.6-12)

The Lord isn't really being slow about his promise, as some people think. No, he is being patient for your sake. He does not want anyone to be destroyed, but wants everyone to repent.

2 Peter 3:9 (NLT)

- First trumpet: A third of the land is set on fire (v.7)
- Second trumpet: A great mountain of fire kills a third of the sea (v.8-9)
- Third trumpet: A third of fresh water was poisoned by a falling star (v.10-11)
- Fourth trumpet: A third of the day and night's light was darkened (v.12)
