I. WHY IS THE WORD OF GOD SO IMPORTANT?

1. Scripture is our primary source of truth

Sanctify them by the truth; your word is truth.

John 17:17 (NIV)

2. Scripture is our primary source of faith

So then faith comes by hearing, and hearing by the word of God.

Romans 10:17 (NKJV)

3. Scripture is our primary source of growth (See Psalm 1:1-3)

All Scripture is inspired by God and is useful to teach us what is true and to make us realize what is wrong in our lives. It corrects us when we are wrong and teaches us to do what is right. God uses it to prepare and equip his people to do every good work.

6. Equips me for victory

A final word: Be strong in the Lord and in his mighty power. Put on all of God's armor so that you will be able to stand firm against all strategies of the devil. For we are not fighting against flesh-and-blood enemies, but against evil rulers and authorities of the unseen world, against mighty powers in this dark world, and against evil spirits in the heavenly places. Therefore, put on every piece of God's armor so you will be able to resist the enemy in the time of evil. 7. Supplies me with promises
