II. WHAT PRAYER IS

Essentially prayer is a conversation with a friend – who happens to be God

III. HOW PRAYER EMPOWERS MY SPIRITUAL GROWTH—PRAYER:

1. Raises my awareness of God’s presence

The LORD is close to all who call on him, yes, to all who call on him in truth.

Never stop praying.

1 Thessalonians 5:17 (NLT)

2. Reinforces my trust in God’s love

Since he did not spare even his own Son but gave him up for us all, won’t he also give us everything else?... Can anything ever separate us from Christ’s love? Does it mean he no longer loves us if we have trouble or calamity, or are persecuted, or hungry, or destitute, or in danger, or threatened with death?...No, despite all these things, overwhelming victory is ours through Christ, who loved us.

3. Recognizes my submission to God

“Father...not my will, but yours be done.”

Luke 22:42 (NIV)

4. Replaces my worry with His peace

Always be full of joy in the Lord. I say it again—rejoice! Let everyone see that you are considerate in all you do. Remember, the Lord is coming soon. Don’t worry about anything; instead, pray about everything. Tell God what you need, and thank him for all he has done. Then you will experience God’s peace, which exceeds anything we can understand. His peace will guard your hearts and minds as you live in Christ Jesus.

5. Realigns my thinking with His Wisdom
